Two Territories of the New West remain to be admitted. These are New Mexico and Arizona. These Territories have a population large enough for statehood, and the day seems near at hand when they, too, will join the Union. Their admission will mark the last event in the great Westward Movement.¹

¹In some of the States of the New West, as in South Dakota, Utah, Montana, and Oklahoma, the people engage personally and directly in the business of making laws. They do this by means of a political device known as the *initiative and referendum*. The initiative enables a certain per cent. of the voters to propose to the legislature a bill which that body must enact as a law; the referendum enables the voters to vote upon a law which they have commanded the legislature to refer to them. This system of direct legislation is also in operation in Nevada, Missouri, and Maine.
