1. East of Arabia, in the southern part of Asia, are two great peninsulas; and a little farther south, in the ocean, is a cluster of the largest islands in the world.

These peninsulas and islands together are usually called The Indies, though each of them has a separate name.

2. These are all hot countries, with plenty of rain, and are remarkable for the abundance of vegetable and animal productions, as well as for mineral wealth.
