XXIX. - SOUTHERN STATES.

(PART I., PAGES 33-37.)

In the journey down the Mississippi we saw cotton growing soon after passing the mouth of the Ohio. All the States lying farther south than this, whether in the Atlantic Plain or in the Central Plain, produce cotton, and most of them make it their principal crop: hence all of them together are sometimes called the cotton States. Four border on the Atlantic, four on the Gulf, and two are inland. Those on the coast are often called the South Atlantic States and Gulf States.
