XLI.-COLD COUNTRIES OF NORTH AMERICA.

We have learned that the greater part of this continent, north of the United States, is a cold forest land with few

inhabitants but Indians, and that the Arctic shores, where the Eskimos live, are colder and almost barren. In the sea to the northeast, are Greenland and Iceland, which belong to Denmark. All of the northern part of the continent, except Alaska, belongs to Great Britain. It is divided into several provinces, which together form the *Dominion of Canada*. Montreal is the only great city of the Dominion, but Quebec is older.
