as the various occupations of the class room may suggest for the blackboard.

New words are not given in the headings in Part Two. Let the children find the new words. They should then be placed upon the blackboard. The hunt for new words will excite interest.

Nursery rhymes and poetry appeal to children. They enjoy the rhythm. Why not let them read it to begin?
