# COUNTRIES.

Questions.—What is its relative position? What are its boundaries on the north?—on the east?—south?—west?

Example.—British Possessions?—Situated in the northern part of North America,—bounded on the north by the Arctic Ocean, on the east by Baffin's Bay and the Atlantic Ocean, south by the United States, and west by the Pacific Ocean and Russian Possessions.

#### SEAS GULPS BAYS ETC.
