

LESSON XXI.

EXERCISES ON THE MAP OF NORTH AMERICA.

The following arrangement of exercises will be found very convenient in preparing classes for examination.

COUNTRIES.

Questions.—What is its relative position? What are its boundaries on the north?—on the east?—south?—west?

EXAMPLE.—British Possessions?—Situated in the northern part of North America,—bounded on the north by the Arctic Ocean, on the east by Baffin's Bay and the Atlantic Ocean, south by the United States, and west by the Pacific Ocean and Russian Possessions.

SEAS, GULFS, BAYS, ETC.

Questions.—What shores does it wash? To what larger waters is it tributary?

EXAMPLE.—Gulf of Mexico?—Washes the south shore of the United States and the east coast of Mexico, is nearly inclosed by the peninsulas of Florida and Yucatan, and is tributary to the Atlantic Ocean.

RIVERS.
