## LESSON XLI.

## NEW JERSEY.

1. NEW JERSEY is celebrated for its fine fruit, and the excellent quality of its garden vegetables.
2. The southern portion of the state is flat and sandy. The middle section is diversified with hills, which, in the extreme north, attain the altitude of mountains.
3. The soil in the central and southern portions is naturally light and sandy, but capable of improvement by the use

of marl which is very abundant there. The northern portion is of moderate fertility, but well adapted to tillage and pasturage.

4. The staple agricultural productions are wheat, rye, Indian corn, oats, potatoes, and butter. The orchard and garden products of New Jersey are relatively greater than those of any other state, and find an ample market in the cities of New York and Philadelphia.

5. The most valuable zinc mines in the United States are found in Sussex County, in the northern part of the state.
